FOREST SCHOOL

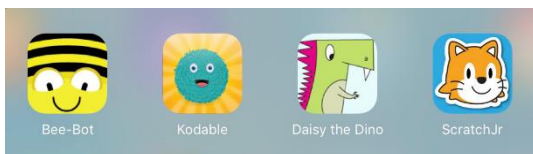

The session was thoroughly enjoyed by all.

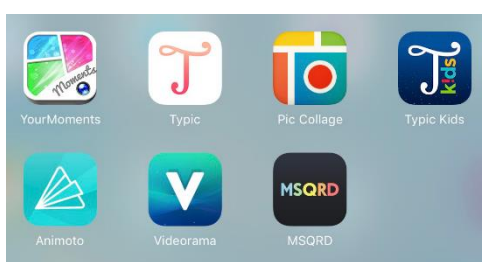


Apps for Half Term
