Specific use of the students as a resource to contribute in their national language as well as their 'family' language demonstrates

clearly the valuing of diversity and cultural equality as does accepting material on the twin space in ten languages. The use of drama, direct video delivery and puppetry engages creativity in an enjoyable and child centred way. This project reinforces the basic premise of eTwinning since its inception that it is motivating, educationally effective and fun."
