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OFSTED

As you are aware we had our Ofsted inspection this week. Thank you to everyone who participated in parent view and spoke to the inspectors. The team looked at all the aspects of the school, including talking to various different groups of children. At this stage we are unable to share the results of their findings with you as there is a process that the report has to go through. Initially it is written by the team and then goes through a quality assurance process. After the half term break it will then be sent back to us in order to check for factual accuracy eg names, numbers etc, not the wording of the text. This then goes back to Ofsted and there could be further quality assurance checks. Usually a report is published with 19 working days of an inspection (the half term break does not count as working days) but if it is randomly selected for the further quality assurance process it will be published within 28 working days. As soon as we are able to we will share the final report with you.
