READING

We have been assessing all the children in school to make sure that they are all on the correct level of reading books. By doing this we have found that many of our children are able to read well but their

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comprehension (understanding) is not as well developed as their ability to read the actual words. As children move out of foundation and year 1 into

year 2 and beyond, all formal assessment of reading is about the comprehension of the texts.

Throughout the school we work on helping children to understand what they are reading through guided reading sessions and formal comprehension lessons. In order to develop good

comprehension skills it is often necessary for children to read a book that is well within their capabilities and does not have words in that they are learning to read. As a result of the work that we have undertaken you might find that your child brings home a different level book to the one that

they have been reading. We appreciate all the work you do at home supporting your child with their reading. We would like to ask you, as well as hearing them read, to question them about the page they have read. For example you might ask them about how a character is feeling, what might

happen next in the story, why they think something has happened, or what the scene is like. You may also want to question the understanding of words with your child and see if they could use a

word from the page you have just read in a sentence of their own. We thank you for the work you do in supporting us with teaching your child to read and ask you if you could now take this extra step with us to enable them to become even more accomplished readers. ΡΤΑ
