

You may or may not be aware that Leicestershire is one of the lowest funded education authorities in the country. The government had promised to look at a fair funding formula so that some of the discrepancies between authorities were ironed out. This would mean that our children in Leicestershire would receive a greater amount of money per pupil which will enable us to provide a better standard of education for them. Many of our schools are in deficient budgets and facing staffing redundancies and inadequate teaching resources as a result of poor funding. It now appears that the government might not be carrying out the fair funding review this year as promised. But seeking to delay this. We have been urged to encourage you to sign the fair funding campaign petition so that our children can receive the funding they need as soon as possible in order to give them a good standard of education.

The petition reads as follows:

The petition of residents of North West Leicestershire,

Declares that the petitioners believe the existing school funding model in England is arbitrary and unfair; further declares that the ten best funded areas of England have on average received grants of £6,300 per pupil this year, compared to an average of £4,200 per pupil in the ten most poorly funded areas of England; and further declares that the petitioners welcome the Government's commitment to introduce fairer school funding.

The petitioners therefore request that the House of Commons supports the earliest possible introduction of a new National Funding Formula for schools in England.
