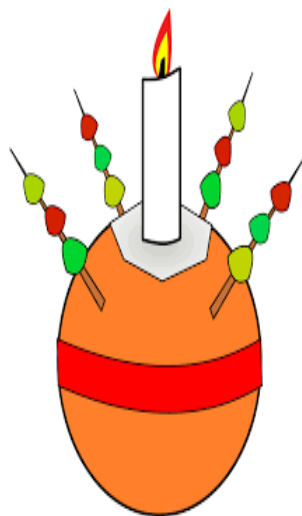


## Christingle Service
